Topic

The aim of the Summer School is to examine and explore water tanks and spouts of Zemgale rivers, ponds and lakes. To create a new and different perspective on Zemgale's existing watercourses and landscape space, we will come up with new recommendations for improvement.

Location

The Summer School will take place in Jelgava and Riga.

Programme

Students will be offered an intensive nine day programme of lectures, discussions and workshops, as well as sightseeing tours and parties. Programme includes:

- listen to lectures on ecology, habitats in the urban environment and beyond, habitat association with human perception, a sense of place, visualization and development of the aquatic environment and the history of design, modeling, value and lack of identification and use;
- planned joint activities with local school students;
- valuable and interactive exhibitions and tours;
- investigate the Latvian water resources, the diversity and the richness of their history and mythology;
- familiarization with local culture and traditions;
- ecological research and analysis;
- drawing and photographic art classes;
- final work presentation.

Workshops

In four creative workshops led by an experienced team of specialists, the participants will shape their vision of the environmental values of the cultural, ecological, and traditional point of view.

Participants Fee

The fee including registration, tuition, accommodation, meals and social programs is EUR 711. A number of bursaries are available (deadline April 25, 2016).

Academic credits

Participants of the Summer School will be awarded a Certificate from the Latvian University of Agriculture and 3 ECTS points upon completion of the course.
